

MISSION TRIP COORDINATOR

This August, ten FL-GA District members and two other individuals went on a mission trip to Point of Grace Academy (POGA) outside Kisumu, Kenya.

For 13 years, POGA has provided top-notch educations to students from all areas of Kenya. With just 11 students in 2011, it's grown to over 600 Primary and 200 High School students. POGA provides for their spiritual growth with chapel services, plus religious classes during the week. POGA has added a clinic to their campus that services the students and surrounding community, providing standard medical care.



During the week-long trip, team members worked with the students and taught religious stories. We also helped in the clinic, assisting the technicians and workers. Delicious breakfasts fueled us for the various activities of the day. We contemplated the Bible verse of the day as we went about our activities. After wonderful lunches, some of us played games with the students or just talked with them. Yummy suppers were followed by a devotion led by Pastor Dennis Meeker, one POGA's founders. Saturday we hosted supper for the students, with some of us dishing out food for the children. The meal consisted of rice, chicken, chapati (flatbread), cabbage, and watermelon, along with a soda to drink. This meal helped cement bonds between students and our team, On Sunday we attended church service at the POGA chapel, with Pastor Jeff Moore preaching on John 6 and Pastor Tim Brown (our FL-GA Senior Pastoral Counselor) leading the liturgy. The children sang beautifully! Monday the girls and boys received dresses and shorts that were sewn and donated by ladies from the LWML FL-GA and Michigan Districts. We sorted through donated supplies, clothing, Bibles, and catechisms we had brought with us in our checked luggage - 32 bags in total. We all look forward to returning soon!
