President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order.

Pastor/Elders: No report.

Correspondence: Nothing received.

Minutes: A correction was made to the October 10th 2016 minutes. Under the Treasurers report it was noted in the first sentence that "a check" was a "direct deposit".

Treasurer: The treasurer's report was accepted.

Financial Secretary: The report was accepted.

Trustees Report: It was decided that the LWML women will clean the church on Dec 10th. The men will do the outside lawn work. LWML will also be making Christmas cookie platters later that morning. The trustees report was accepted

SCRIP: October's profit was \$33.25. The checkbook balance is \$1251.39.

Old Business:

Nominating Committee: We still need nominations for President, Vice President, additional trustees and additional elders. Right now there are no nominations available.

Hearing Aid Loop: Ron Cowan will be obtaining a quote. He will have the information available for the Congregational meeting on Nov 20th 2016. Sandwiches for Dunnellon High School on Dec 2nd and Dec 16th: Jackie Hucker will put cards in our member`s mailboxes asking for help preparing the sandwiches. She will also buy all the food needed and bring it to the church.

New Business:

Motion: Bud Koehlinger made a motion to continue using \$200 a month from the LCEF fund into missions. Doug O'Hara seconded. The motion passed.

No changes were needed for the 2017 spending guide.

Linda Williams will address the Christmas Dinner at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday. Linda said the church will provide the meat and the members will be asked to bring side dishes or desserts. She will also discuss the Christmas Cookie platters. Liz Koehlinger advised that we can purchase a 2 x 2 color ad in the Village Crier for \$75 for 2 months.

Motion: Doug O`Hara made a motion to purchase the above stated ad. Linda Williams seconded the motion. Motion passed.

President Sheryl Lutz thanked everyone for their hard work and help during her term as President.

The meeting was adjourned with the singing of the Doxology.

President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order with Pastor Terry McKee opening with prayer. Sheryl Lutz thanked all of the church officers for their help during her term as President.

Attendance: 38

Minutes: The minutes were approved.

Correspondence: None received.

Reports:

Financial Secretary: The Fund Summary report was accepted.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer's report was discussed and accepted.

Trustees Report: The report was reviewed and accepted.

LWML: Linda Williams thanked all the ladies of LWML for a successful year.

SCRIP: Barbara Miesen stated that Novembers order totaled \$4280, with a profit of \$181.39. We purchased 80 Walmart cards at a cost of \$25 each for a total of \$2,000. These cards will be distributed to needy families during the holiday season.

Elders/Pastor: Pastor Terry thanked Bud and Liz Koehlinger for all their help during Pastor's time here at Peace Lutheran. The Koehlingers will be moving in the near future. Pastor then said that we will be receiving 6 new members next Sunday. Lastly, he stated that his health insurance is back with Concordia starting January 1st. In addition, the cost of his health insurance is lower than last year.

Election of Officers: Sheryl Lutz stated that we do not have any candidates nominations for President or Vice President. Also, Doug O'Hara is the only elder and we need 2 to 3 more elders. Steve Cassan, Linda Williams and Ron Cowan are our trustees, but we need another trustee. Linda Williams asked for help cleaning the church once a month. Don Dow thanked all the trustees for all the work they do in cleaning the church.

Motion: Don Dow made a motion to reelect Doug O`Hara as elder, and Linda Williams and Ron Cowan as trustees. Bob Sullivan seconded the motion. The motion was accepted.

Motion: Don Dow made a motion to accept the 2017 Spending Guide. Jackie Hucker seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Motion passed.

Old Business:

Kitchen committee: Sam McKee stated he has a bid of \$29,226 for the kitchen improvements. This would include bringing the electric and plumbing up to code. Also, a new large hot water heater will be put in. The cabinets with be removed and replaced. The outside kitchen wall will be repaired. New counter tops and backsplashes will be put in. There will be an island in the middle of the kitchen for storage. A garbage disposal will be put in and lastly, the ceiling will be redone with a textured finish.

Motion: Jackie Hucker made a motion to accept the above proposed bid. Rita Cowan seconded the motion. The motion passed. It was noted that the cost of the kitchen improvements will come from the LCEF account.

Sheryl Lutz stated that our accounting program, Shepherds Staff is self-auditing. Therefore there is no need for an outside audit.

New Business:

Audio loop for Sanctuary. Ron Cowan explained that this is a system that will help members who wear hearing aids to hear better in the sanctuary. The cost will be approximately \$4788. Much discussion followed.

Motion: Linda Williams made a motion to purchase the loop system at a cost of approx. \$4,788 for the sanctuary. Bud Koehlinger seconded the motion. The motion passed with one member opposed.

The LWML will be packing Christmas cookies on Saturday Dec 9th. Becky Williams noted that we will be preparing large platters for the Fire Dept, the Police Dept and the EMT's. Other smaller platers will be made for our members to take to their neighbors or friends in need. Sheryl Lutz also stated on Dec 9th, that the men will be cleaning the outside of the church specifically the edging of the driveway. The LWML women will also be cleaning the inside of the church after packing the cookies.

Sheryl Lutz asked for a hand count of who would like to have a Christmas Dinner at the church. It was decided to have a Christmas Dinner. Linda Williams stated the church will provide the turkey, and the members will bring side dishes or desserts. Bob Sullivan encouraged the congregation to buy new, unwrapped toys or donate money for "Toys for Tots".

Sheryl Lutz thanked everyone for their help during her term as President. In turn, Don Dow thanked Sheryl for her service. Jeremy McKee made a motion to adjourn. Bob Sullivan seconded the motion. The meeting closed with the singing of the doxology.

Where has this year gone? How can it be December already? We must be having fun, because time is flying!

We are about to close out another year and enter 2017; however, we have already begun a new Church Year, with the beginning of Advent. The color for the season of Advent is blue, signifying repentance and hope as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth.

On Christmas Eve, and through the first Sunday after Epiphany, the paraments will be white, to symbolize perfection, joy and purity.

The advent wreath's blue candles represent hope, love and peace; the rose-colored one, lit on the third Sunday of Advent, represents joy. The white candle is lit Christmas Eve, as we rejoice in the birth of our Savior. The origin of the advent wreath was in the Lutheran Church of Sweden.

Christmas trees are a Protestant custom dating back to the 1500s, although some German homes used greenery, sometimes even full trees, in the 1400s. Decorations were edible foods like apples and nuts. Martin Luther was the first to use candles on his tree.

Our sanctuary tree has new ornaments on it this year. They are called "Chrismons", because they are based on Christian symbols. You will find their descriptions and meanings in this newsletter and are welcome to take a closer look.

In doing my research for this article, I discovered that December 17th is set aside to remember "Daniel the Prophet and the Three Young Men". As the Wednesday morning Bible study class has been learning, they lived in interesting times!
