## Peace Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 8 2017

Present: Garry Kurth, Hope Kurth, Jan Barker, Rita Cowan, Becky Williams, Doug O`Hara, Steve Cassan, Ron Cowan, and Pastor McKee.

President Garry Kurth called the meeting to order and Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

**Correspondence:** We received a Thank You letter from Universal Lutheran Church & Student Center.

**Minutes:** Hope Kurth made a motion to accept the minutes from Aprils meeting. Ron Cowan seconded. The minutes were accepted.

**Financial Secretary:** Becky Williams fund summary report was accepted.

**Treasurer's Report:** Rita Cowan's reports were accepted.

**Trustees:** Linda Williams was not present but she submitted her report. Ron Cowan purchased a fence post driver. She thanked Gene Lutz for building and mounted a small food pantry outside the front door. When Gene Lutz returns, we will ask him to put doors on the pantry to keep the "critters" out. Lastly, her report suggested hiring Mrs. Marsh to clean the church weekly at a fee of \$35 per

week. Much discussion followed. It was determined that this will be brought up at the Church Congregational Meeting.

**SCRIP:** March's order totaled \$1,925 with a profit of \$68.97.

**Elders:** Nothing to report.

Pastor: Jerry and Janice Robertson will be received through letter of transfer to our congregation. Pastor also stated that 3-4 more people will be joining shortly. Pastor thanked Gene Lutz for fixing the sprinkler system near the prayer garden. He also thanked Sam McKee for replacing bulbs at the exit light near the front door.

Old Business: The church collected \$1,000 to donate for the Military Biblesticks. Pastor McKee then stated that our funds will be matched! The Spaghetti Supper plans are coming along. Lastly, the Ace Hardware charge account has not been set up yet.

New Business: The Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 21st 2017. Reformation Sunday is on October 29<sup>th</sup> 2017. This will be the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Pastor McKee suggested having a dinner after service. This will be brought up to the congregation at the meeting on May 21<sup>st</sup>. Sharon Cassan has volunteered to be our new publicity director.

Hope Kurth made a motion to adjourn. Rita Cowan seconded. The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.

President's Comments: President Garry Kurth introduced himself and told of his church background. He urged us to try to encourage new members, especially younger people. He also said he will do what is right for the church's well-being. Lastly, he encouraged our members to become more active in the church.

## **Reports:**

**Financial Secretary:** Becky Williams submitted her fund summary. It was reviewed with no questions or concerns.

Treasurers Report: Rita Cowan submitted her reports. Also submitted was a letter to the church advising how blessed we have been in donations etc. She also thanked Garry Kurth, and Chet and Dianne Rochette for volunteering their time for special projects. Lastly thanking Cindy McKee for finding a much cheaper health insurance plan for Pastor.

**Trustees:** Linda Williams advised that Gene Lutz has made a Pantry Box located near the front door. We will probably need doors made when Gene returns from his vacation to help keep the critters out.

SCRIP: Barbara Miesen explained the SCRIP project in full. Every SCRIP card purchased for any amount is given to the buyer in that amount. The SCRIP vendors give a commission back to our church for every card purchased. It is a great way to help raise money for the church.

Elders: Doug O`Hara stated that his main focus is the spiritual well-being of Pastor McKee and our Peace family. He wants us to use the talents of all our members, such as participation in one of our events, or going into

town and inviting family, friends or strangers to our church.

Pastors Report: Pastor Terry reminded everyone of the Ascension Service on Thursday, May 25 at 7:00 PM. He said we have been blessed with taking in 15 new members since our last meeting in November. Also, Jerry and Janice Robertson will be transferring to Peace. Pastor is working on having another class for others wishing to join our Peace family. He then reminded the congregation to greet one another at Sunday worship. Also, to talk to visitors before or after service to invite them to be part of our fellowship time.

Old Business: The kitchen project has been completed. Sam McKee thanked Jean Bozak and Pastor Terry McKee for all their help. The Audio Loop System has been installed and is working great. We are prepared for any new members or visitors with hearing impairments. Lastly, a CD player has been installed for the playing of the music during service, which works much better than the old computer system.

**New Business:** The pantry box hs been installed. The 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation is October 29 2017. We will have a special service, celebration and a dinner following the service. Cindy McKee will be planning the dinner. Linda Williams has someone she knows who is willing to clean the church for \$35 per week.

She thanked some members for going that extra mile to help, but she encouraged more volunteers to step up to help. A sign-up sheet will be posted on the bulletin board.

SCRIP Profits: Cindy McKee stated that she works at The Inverness Club. It is a Senior Residence for low income seniors over 62 years of age, and disabled people of legal age. It provides low income housing and one meal a day for the residents. Cindy explained that there are many residents that struggle every day to meet their bare necessities.

Motion: Don Dow made a motion to purchase 16 \$25 gift cards, Total of \$400, (which is the profit from the SCRIP program) to be handed out to some of the members of the Inverness club. Hope Kurth seconded the motion. Cindy McKee will coordinate with the Director at the Inverness Club as to who receives the gift cards. Discussion followed. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Sharon Cassan has volunteered to be our new publicity person. Lastly, Tricia and Trina Ruttinger and Jae Ann Witzgall will be taking over our Facebook page. Sheryl Lutz will continue to handle the church's website.

The meeting closed with prayer.

The only exceptions to this is daily needs.

Here is a partial list of foods/other items we can take:

Canned: meats, vegetables, fruits, applesauce
Plastic: peanut butter, jelly, liquid soap, shampoo, lotion
Other daily needs: bars of soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes.
