# Summary Peace Lutheran Church Council <u>Meeting</u>

## October 10, 2016

Present: Sheryl Lutz, Jan Barker, Rita Cowan, Rebekah Williams, Doug O'Hara, Bud Koehlinger, Bob Sullivan, Ron Cowan, Jackie Hucker, Linda Williams, Steve Cassan, Liz Koehlinger, Rev. Terry McKee.

President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order and Pastor Terry opened the meeting with prayer.

Pastor/Elders: Pastor Terry advised that Life South has not returned our call so there will not be a blood drive at the church. Also, there will not be a Life Screening scheduled since they were not compliant with the times that Pastor Terry offered them. Pastor Terry then advised that his health insurance cost is increasing at the end of the year and it does not have Dental or Eye Care coverage. He has contacted Concordia and has been offered better coverage with a lower out of pocket expense.

**MOTION:** Doug O'Hara made a motion for Pastor to go back on Concordia's health insurance plan. Bud Koehlinger seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Pastor stated that this coming Sunday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, is LWML Sunday. Pastor will be on vacation. Pastor Scheer will conduct the service for us. Pastor Terry mentioned the District Synod convention this past summer. He said that Pastor Rocky would be holding a Post-Convention Recap to go over what the Synod passed. It will be held at St. John's Lutheran Church in Ocala on November 6<sup>th</sup> 2016 at 3:30 PM. He encouraged all who are interested to attend.

**Correspondence:** None reported.

Minutes: The minutes were reviewed. Rita Cowan had a question regarding the statement under the Pastor/Elder report. The minutes read "the Church's financial reports should be available for everyone in the congregation". It should be rewritten, as "The congregation should be informed of how the Church is doing financially" No other corrections were needed.

Treasurers Report: Rita Cowan mentioned a check for approx. \$800 from Thrivent Choice Dollars. Rita and Becky Williams will prepare a financial summary report to be put in the church congregation's mailboxes in November before the Congregational Meeting. The treasurer's report was accepted.

**Fund Summary:** Becky Williams stated she put \$60 from the Oktoberfest profit into the Mission's fund. The fund summary was accepted.

**Trustees Report:** Ron Cowan's report was reviewed and accepted. In summary, it stated that a new sign was purchased for Oktoberfest at a cost of \$80. The A/C filters were changed. The new

stove and refrigerator have been delivered. Lastly the mowing was put off a week due to Hurricane Matthew.

**SCRIP:** No official report was received.

**Old Business:** Rita Cowan advised that she spoke with two several accountants and the cost is \$5,000 or more. It was also discussed that it is not in our constitution that we need to do an annual audit. Pastor Terry advised that "Shepherd's Staff" is a self-auditing program.

MOTION: Bob Sullivan made a motion to rescind last year's motion to do an annual audit. An audit is not necessary because of the Shepard's Staff program. Bud Koehlinger seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Regarding the Nominating Committee, Doug O'Hara will be holding a meeting after Bible Study on Wednesday.

**MOTION:** Bob Sullivan made a motion to put the \$525 profit from the Oktoberfest into "General Funds". Ron Cowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Liz Koehlinger advised that "Mission Insight" is offering free mailing list for Demographics within a 15-mile radius. Sheryl Lutz will look into this.

Jackie Hucker stated that we would be packing 50 lunches for the High School Basketball Team on December 2<sup>nd</sup> and Dec 16<sup>th</sup>. Jackie will apply to Thrivent for seed money.

New Business: Sheryl Lutz has received information from "Lutheran Friends of the Deaf" concerning a grant for the loop system that Ron Cowan has brought up earlier this year. It was decided that this is a great investment due to many people of our congregation with hearing issues. The cost of the system is approximately \$6,000.

**MOTION:** Becky Williams made a motion to bring up the "Loop System" to the congregation for their approval at our Congregational Meeting in November. Linda Williams seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Reformation Sunday is October 30<sup>th</sup>. Linda Williams will coordinate a Pot Luck for that Sunday.

**Presidents Report:** Sheryl Lutz thanked everyone who worked on Oktoberfest. A special "Thank You" to Bob Sullivan for coordinating the event and preparing a report for us to refer to as we plan our next Oktoberfest.

Thanks also to Rita and Ron Cowan for the work they did on the refrigerator and the stove.

Pastor Terry requested permission to order \$2000 in SCRIP cards for the needy during upcoming Holidays, funds to be taken from the General fund. Order will be placed on November 13<sup>th</sup> 2016.

# WhoWhatWhereWhyWhenHow?

As the growing season draws to a close and we look forward to the harvest, we continue to display green paraments until the last Sunday of the church year. The new church year begins with the first Sunday in Advent. The color blue before us during Advent reminds us to repent of our sins and that our hope is in our Savior, whose birth we await. When All Saints Day is celebrated on the Sunday closest to November 1st, the color is white, indicating the purity of Christ, and our salvation from sin through His death and resurrection.

Advent always begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, falling anywhere between November 27th and December 3rd. This year it is the earliest it can be. During this period, we await and prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth and are reminded of His final coming. The Latin "adventus" means "coming".

Concordia Publishing House has a website, <a href="www.todayinthechurchyear.org">www.todayinthechurchyear.org</a> that provides daily information about commemorations and celebrations through the church year. Our Lutheran Service Book gives dates and names. The website gives more specific information about each.

Daylight Savings Time ends on Sunday, November 6th. If you forget to "Fall Back" an hour, you will be early for Bible class or church. You can enjoy fellowship with others who forgot!

Veteran's Day this year is on Friday, November 11th. Many people confuse Memorial Day and Veteran's Day. The first is for remembering those who died in service to their country, especially during times of war, while the second is set aside for thanking and honoring living members of our services in both wartime and peacetime. Remember to thank a veteran! And, "Thank you!" our members who are veterans. We know you are many and represent every service.

Thanksgiving is Thursday, November 24th. The first nationwide Thanksgiving was proclaimed by George Washington on November 26th, 1789. President Franklin Roosevelt changed the day from the last Thursday to the fourth Thursday in 1941.

Please let me know if there is anything you'd like explained, perhaps an unfamiliar term or why we do something during worship, and I will address it in this column.

# Living as a Local Missionary

There are five groupings of unchurched people in our culture today:

**Group 5**: Most resistant, even antagonistic to the church and the Gospel. They are skeptical of the Bible and the claims of Christianity. Many have had a wounding church experience earlier in their lives.

Group 4: Resistant to the Gospel but not antagonistic; they may believe in the afterlife, and possibly heaven and hell. Christ is viewed as a historical figure. They have prayed as a "safety net" but don't know if anyone listens. They resist attempts to convert them.

**Group 3**: No real interest in the church but open to discussions and believe in heaven and hell. They have a positive view of Jesus and of Christians but have puzzling ideas about God.

Group 2: May say the right "spiritual" things but they have not made a personal step of faith. They often believe that one must work one's way into heaven, and are probably open to studying the Bible and to discussing it. They would be open to an invitation to visit a church.

Group 1: Receptive to hearing about the Gospel and spiritual conversations. They have probably been involved in a church at some point in their lives and feel bad about not attending church. They pray on a regular basis, but tend to believe that one works their way into heaven.

To reach any of these people, we must develop a relationship and involve them in conversation.

Try to determine which group the person you are contacting belongs to, to get a feel for how far to go in planting the seeds of belief in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. If the person is apparently agreeing with you on spiritual matters but is not currently attending a church, issue a warm invitation to attend church with you.

To help assess the spiritual state of your contact, you might ask:

- 1. Tell me a little about your religious background.
- 2. How would you describe your attitude about the church?
- 3. What is your view of a typical Christian?
- 4. How do you believe one gets to Heaven?
- 5. What do you think about Jesus?

Our role is not to argue or "teach" but simply to say a few words about our beliefs and offer a short personal testimony.

As local missionaries we must remember that it will probably take many conversations and invitations for us to see any results. All we do is to plant the seed and let the Holy Spirit do the work and as in the parable about the seeds (Matt.13), the people in some of these groups are pretty "rocky ground" so we may need to re-plant again and again.

This was printed several years ago. I am re-submitting it because it is important to Peace today; some members have never seen it, and many of those who did read it may be open to a reminder.
