It took me a few attempts to ask before he agreed to share his reasons over one of the dinners the four of us regularly shared.

The dinner discussion started off with questions and answers of what happened, when, and how that formulated his opinion about God. As the

evening continued, a few questions struck him, and he began to share with us a very raw, hurt, and unhealed part of his heart. We couldn't begin to have all the answers. But we were able to listen with compassion and continued to remind him of the Gospel and God's love for him - for each of us.

He came to no conclusions that night, but I'm thankful we were available to plant a seed in his heart.

of the Lutheran Women in Mission. It also lifts our sights to live fearlessly as a church. It resets our focus to God our father when we are distracted by fear.




will reap, if we do not give up

† To increase our knowledge of Christ.


† To become more constant in our love and obedience for and to Him.

Collectively Consecrated to Christ: Remembering the Past

In 1945, the Florida branch of Southern District had four charter societies. The LWML Florida-Georgia District was formed in 1948.

The Scholarship program was always an important part of our mite giving. Now each biennium \$30,000 of our mite giving goes to pastoral students and non-pastoral church workers such as teachers, deaconesses, DCEs, and others that will receive a divine call. Three scholarships were given the first year: Donald Muchow and Gilbert Schillinger of Winter Haven, FL and Walter Anderson of Columbus, GA.

Did you know that our Love scholarship fund is called the "Dorothea Rinkenberger LOVE gifts"? Dorothea Rinkenberger served as scholarship chairman from 1952-1988. She had other district assignments, but the Scholarship Committee was

where she invested most of her love and attention, treating each recipient as her own child. The first Love gift was awarded to Richard Lineberger of Tampa FL in 1984.



The Kuiper Endowment Fund, which Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Kuiper of Deland, FL established in 1991, is used for students who are interested in special interest programs that are mindful of missions. The first recipient was Benito Perez of Miami, FL, for Cuban ministry in South Florida.

We thank Ruth Vorpagel, Joanne Hahn, Desiree Crawford, Carol Alberts, and Lois Ford, for their service as chairmen and all those who donate to scholarships.

Anna Moore, a former recipient, phrased it so beautifully, "Thank you for allowing God to use you to bless the lives of His people."

in Lake City and to disaster relief. We just gave 24 quilts to Camp Rock, which helps families who lost everything to hurricane Helene.


